

CALL FOR APPLICATIONS FOR THE AWARD OF 3 ANNUAL SCHOLARSHIPS NAMED “IN MEMORY OF CARLO AND PIERGIOGIO,” COVERING THE FULL COST OF TUITION FEES, RESERVED FOR MERITORIOUS STUDENTS WHO WISH TO ENROLL IN THE FIRST YEAR OF ITALIAN LOWER AND UPPER SECONDARY SCHOOLS WITHIN THE JESUIT EDUCATION FOUNDATION FOR THE 2026/2027 SCHOOL YEAR.

REGULATIONS

ART. 1 - AMOUNT AND PURPOSE OF THE SCHOLARSHIPS

The Jesuit Education Foundation announces a selection for the award of 3 (three) “In Memory of Carlo and Piergiorgio” Scholarships, of which 2 (two) cover the full tuition fees for students intending to enroll in the first year of any high school (Liceo) within the Jesuit Education Foundation, and 1 (one) covers the full tuition fees for students intending to enroll in the first year of any lower secondary school (Scuola Secondaria di I grado) within the Jesuit Education Foundation.

The Scholarships will be awarded based on the following priority criteria:

- Academic merit: For scholarships intended for high schools (Licei), the end-of-2nd-year lower secondary school (Scuola Secondaria di I grado) report card, with a minimum grade average of 8 (eight) and a minimum conduct grade of 9 (nine); for the scholarship intended for lower secondary schools, the end-of-4th-year primary school report card, with fully positive evaluations in both academic performance and conduct.
- Economic situation: Valid ISEE indicator not exceeding €35,000.

ART. 2 – DOCUMENTATION

To apply for the call, it is necessary to submit the application by completing the appropriate form and attaching:

1. A copy of the final evaluation report for the 2nd year of lower secondary school (Scuola Secondaria di I grado) for scholarships intended for high schools (Licei), and the final evaluation report for the 4th year of primary school for scholarships intended for lower secondary schools.
2. A brief text (approximately 10–20 lines), preferably written by the candidate or by the parents, explaining the reasons for choosing to continue their studies at the lower or upper secondary schools within the Jesuit Education Foundation. In the motivational letter, particular attention will be given to whether the candidate has participated in extracurricular service activities, or has been involved in community groups in the ecclesial (parish, youth center, scouts, movements, etc.), social (volunteer organizations, other...), cultural (music, dance, chess, creative writing courses...), or sports fields. Each activity mentioned must be accompanied by a document certifying its authenticity and duration.
3. Valid ISEE certificate.

The Jesuit Education Foundation reserves the right to conduct a thorough verification of the submitted documents and to request additional supporting documentation if deemed necessary. Any false statements will result in the forfeiture of any awarded scholarship.

The documentation must be sent **no later than 12:00 p.m. on 15 December 2025** to the email address segreteria@gesuitieducazione.it.

ART. 3 - RANKINGS

The ranking will be prepared by a Committee appointed by the Jesuit Education Foundation (FGE), composed of members of the Board of Directors and operational staff, assigning a maximum score of 100 points, calculated as follows:

- Arithmetic average of the grades in the final report for the 2nd year of lower secondary school (Scuola Secondaria di I grado) for scholarships intended for high schools (Licei), and of the final evaluation report for the 4th year of primary school for scholarships intended for lower secondary schools: max 50 points;
- Motivational letter and documented activities: max 30 points;
- ISEE: max 20 points.

Students with a minimum score of 70/100 will be considered eligible.

ART. 4 – ANNOUNCEMENT OF THE WINNERS

The Committee will announce the winners, and the ranking will be published **by 15 January 2026**. The final award of the scholarship is subject to passing the lower secondary school final exam and enrolling in the first year of a high school (Liceo) within the Jesuit Education Foundation, or to admission and enrollment in the first year of a lower secondary school (Scuola Secondaria di I grado) within an FGE school.

- ART. 5 CONFIRMATION FOR THE YEARS FOLLOWING THE FIRST

The winners of the competition may continue to benefit from the scholarship in the years following the first, provided that:

1. They enroll in the subsequent years of a lower or upper secondary school within the Jesuit Education Foundation;
2. They are successful at the end of the previous school year with an average grade of no less than 8 (eight) and a conduct grade of no less than 9 (nine);
3. The ISEE certificate is submitted each year to both the enrolling school and the Jesuit Education Foundation.

The Jesuit Education Foundation reserves the right to suspend or not renew the scholarship in subsequent years, even if the above conditions are met, should the student's principles or objectives be in conflict with the moral and educational values of the Jesuit schools.

ART. 6 – PROCESSING OF PERSONAL DATA

The personal data provided by applicants and scholarship recipients referred to in Art. 1 of this call will be processed in accordance with EU Regulation No. 2016/679.

Specifically, the data provided will be used and analyzed solely for the purpose of evaluating the scholarship application and for the subsequent management of the relationship in case the application is approved.

The data will be processed in hard copy and/or digital form, without the use of automated processing or profiling systems, solely for the purpose of collecting and storing the data. CALL FOR THE AWARDING OF SCHOLARSHIPS

Art 1 – SCHOLARSHIPS

The Jesuit Education Foundation awards 3 (three) “In Memory of Carlo and Piergiorgio” scholarships to deserving students enrolled in Italian schools within the Jesuit Education Network for attendance in lower and upper secondary school programs.

The Jesuit Education Foundation is a network of schools and other educational institutions. It is an initiative created by the EUM Province to develop the centuries-old educational charism of the Society of Jesus. The Foundation promotes the Jesuit school and educational project, offering a range of services to schools and other educational institutions that wish to join the network.

The decision was made to provide three young people and their families, without any distinction of social class or exclusion, the opportunity to attend Jesuit schools, fostering both academic and personal growth, in line with the tradition of Ignatian pedagogy.

The choice to dedicate the scholarships to Carlo Acutis and Pier Giorgio Frassati was made to honor the memory of two young former students of the Jesuit Education Network schools, who lived their Christian faith and social commitment with such intensity that they were canonized by Pope Leo XIV on 7 September 2025, on the occasion of the Youth Jubilee. Carlo Acutis, a brilliant student in computer science, attended Leone XIII and became the first millennial saint of the Catholic Church. Pier Giorgio Frassati, known for his dedication to the poor and his spiritual life, was a former student of the Istituto Sociale in Turin.

Art 2 – ELIGIBILITY FOR THE SCHOLARSHIP CALL

All families who meet the following requirements may apply for the scholarships referred to in Article 1:

1. Explicitly agree to adhere to the educational program of the school to which the scholarship will be awarded.
2. Demonstrate that their child has the motivational and academic qualifications to benefit from this opportunity.

Art 3 – Applications for the call

Applications for the call must be addressed to the Jesuit Education Foundation, Via Leone XIII 10, Milan 20145, or sent by email to: segreteria@gesuitieducazione.it.

Applications, to be written on plain paper and in accordance with the attached template [SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION FORM], must be signed by both parents or legal guardians and by the potential beneficiary if of legal age.

Applications must be submitted by 15 December 2025. The following documents must be attached:

1. A statement on plain paper explaining the reasons for the application and any documentation relating to extracurricular activities, if applicable;
2. A certificate or self-certification (in accordance with D.P.R. 445 of 28/12/2000) certifying the family status of the student for whom the scholarship is requested;

3. A valid ISEE certificate issued by the Municipality or another authorized body, along with any documentation demonstrating actual financial difficulty;
4. A copy of the evaluation report mentioned above.

The Foundation's Committee also reserves the right to request additional information or documentation from applicants, if necessary or useful to verify compliance with the requirements outlined in Article 2 above.

Art 4 – Selection criteria

The awarding of the scholarships is determined at the sole discretion of the President of the Board of Directors of the Foundation.

Once the required economic conditions of the applicants have been verified, and following any possible interviews with the candidates, the Committee will draw up a merit ranking based on documented and objective elements related to the applicants' economic situation and the academic performance previously demonstrated by the students for whom the scholarship is requested.

Art 5 – Notification of the award

The President of the Jesuit Education Foundation, following the resolution of the President of the Board of Directors regarding the awarding of the scholarships, will communicate the outcome to the recipients, preferably **by 15 January 2026**, through the communication channels of the Jesuit Education Foundation.

Art 6 – Acceptance and Disbursement

The scholarship recipients, or in the case of minors, their parents or legal guardians, must confirm in writing to the Foundation their acceptance of the scholarships. This confirmation must be submitted to the Foundation using the appropriate form, in accordance with the one attached to this call [SCHOLARSHIP ACCEPTANCE FORM], within seven days of the scholarship being awarded.

In consideration of the purpose of the scholarships, as outlined in Article 1, the scholarships, after applying any applicable legal withholdings, will be paid directly by the Jesuit Education Foundation to the schools, acting on behalf of the recipient, to fully cover the tuition fees for the class in which the recipient is enrolled.

In the event that one or more scholarship recipients renounce the scholarship, the President of the Board of Directors will reassign it to other candidates on the ranking, provided that the students still meet both the subjective and objective conditions for enrollment in the school courses, and that they remain interested in the educational and formative program of the school to which the scholarship will be awarded. The family will also assume responsibility for the regular attendance of the student. A condition for acceptance and disbursement of the scholarship is that the student does not receive any other form of financial support for their school education.
